## Senator Ian Macdonald Visit To Windorah

On Thursday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November, Windorah Community had the opportunity to meet with Senator the Honourable Ian Macdonald, Queensland LNP member.

With community representatives from Business houses, Local Government, the Senior Sector, Health, Community groups and locally employed sharing an afternoon tea, and participating in discussion about where our region of Queensland is heading, and the issues faced by Central West Queensland communities.

When we have Politicians travelling to our unique part of the world, we continue to take the opportunity to represent our communities on the issues of health, the aged, tourism, agriculture, energy, employment and education, and associated costs to living in our remote areas, while reinforcing the Central West region as a proactive player and contributor in sustainable industry in the outback.

One issue raised by the senior community members, was Closing the Gap and pharmaceutical subsidies for the Indigenous population with chronic disease, and the inability for the RFDS to register patients for CTG due to the RFDS currently not being accredited under the GP Practice Program with the Commonwealth Government through Medicare, an issue that the Senator was unaware of. Senator Ian Macdonald would like feedback on the above issue for review, and any other issues community members may have.

# A Christmas Message From The Mayor

Dear Barcoo Shire Residents,

Christmas is here and so soon, and I am not sure whether it is good or bad depending on what is happening in your personal life or at work - as we all struggle to get our Christmas shopping done, plan holidays or brief trips to family and friends, finish work responsibilities or just praying for this dreadful drought to break.

But for all of us Christmas means many things. The Christian faith will celebrate the birth of Jesus and the son of God and what this means to their beliefs. Some will see it as a time for holidays and fun. Some will see it as a time to give a little back to those who are close or have done something special for them or to those who have done it a little tough. Some will get so much joy from giving to the children in their lives as the frenzy to open presents is observed on Christmas Day. And some will renew old friendships lost through the passage of time and busy lives of today's world.

But for everyone I think: it is a time to remember friends and family, some still with us and sometimes far away, some who are suffering illness and are in pain, and sadly some that have passed away and all we have of them is their memories.

Which ever it is for you, enjoy this special time of the year, and embrace the very thing Christmas means to you personally – do that thing that you have always wanted, and tell that special person in your life or friend lost that you do care greatly from them. Please don't waste the spirit and miracle of Christmas in 2018.

Barcoo Shire Council has had a busy year once again, with many roads resheeted and bitumen sealing works projects completed, town street and kerb and channel works progressing and building projects taking place. The 2019 year will be just as busy with the Jundah Roadhouse to be hopefully operational by the tourist season, after finally receiving planning approval, a new house for Jundah will be erected by mid year. There is also many other social and community projects being planned in the towns and at the racecourse and rodeo grounds with support by the Queensland and Australian Governments through the Works for Queensland program and Drought Communities Programs.

The weather extremes continue with severe storms, hurricanes, flash flooding intense cold, and dreadful bush fires in the northern hemisphere. While the southern hemisphere has experienced prolonged droughts across large areas, cyclones and torrential rain in other areas - while the horrifying bush fires threatened vast areas of Queensland during the late spring and early summer.

Once again we have managed to change a sitting prime minister in Australia as Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull stood down, and Scott Morrison was elected leader of the Liberal Party and Coalition Government. Prime Minister Turnbull and his party was plagued with a period of backroom scheming and caucusing, media leaks, shifting alliances and a number of close spill motions against him as the prime minister.

These bizarre events have seen the sixth prime minister change since the fall of the Howard led Coalition Government, has resulted in both the Liberal and Labor Parties move to put rules in place to stop this behaviour of their members. I am certain that the general public are just so sick-and-tired of the self-serving conduct of our elected members, and are completely disillusioned and angry with the removal of a sitting prime minister, indirectly as it is - voted in by the people of Australia.

I am sure, and the polls agree, the Coalition Government will be punished when it goes to the people with an election sometime between now and May 2019 - for its lack of leadership and stability and continued in-fighting. As was the Rudd - Gillard - Rudd Governments were at the 2010 election, when they lost office after just one term.



## Mayor's Message Continued

The bit of positive news from the Australian Government in the lead-up to Christmas came with the announcement of a very positive mid year economic forecast of consecutive surplus budgets in the forward estimates – the first surplus budget since 2007. The Treasurer, Josh Frydenberg indicated that this positive fiscal result will potentially deliver personal income tax cuts and start clawing back the debt from the many years of deficit budgets. There has already been an announcement of increase of \$50 million in funding annually for the Roads to Recovery Program pushing Barcoo Shire's five-year funding to \$2.842170 million for road improvement works.

The Queensland Government has also delivered a positive mid year fiscal outlook with Deputy Premier and Treasurer Jackie Trad announcing the Mid Year Fiscal and Economic Review (MYFER) emphasised a strong economic plan and responsible fiscal management that provides the infrastructure and services Queenslanders need. The positive economic result in Queensland has enabled the Palaszczuk Government to bring forward the third round of the very popular Works for Queensland program with Barcoo Shire receiving \$1.02 million in funding for projects that fit the funding criteria.

This awful drought that is consuming much of Queensland and New South Wales has really disabled the economic base of many regional and remote communities. In many cases, the rainfall for 2018 has been closest to the lowest on record, which has been exacerbated by a really deficient 2017 year as well. Looking at the pattern for the past 6 years since 2012, and apart from the wet winter of 2016, these have been years akin to the millennium drought of the late 1800s and early 1900s or the period between 1964 – 1972 where there was a long period of very low rainfall across much of Queensland.

If you are struggling with making ends meet or you do not feel well in yourself due to the effects of this prolonged drought – there is help out there. Please reach out if there is a need – because there are many social services and wonderful people which are there and willing to help you get through for these types of situations.

As 2018 draws to a close, I would like to thank everyone in our communities for your support in making Barcoo Shire a special place to live and work. A community doesn't just exist - it does so by us all doing a little bit. And if we all do a little bit, collectively we can achieve a lot. Some of this is through your day-to-day work, some is the volunteer work you do, and some is through the care we take for our families and of one and other.

We have lost some of our friends during 2018, so let's take a moment to remember them and their family and friends. We have also greeted new arrivals in 2018 as a number of babies have filled their parents and their families and our communities lives with the joy of nature. There are also some babies on their way, and we wish their parents, particularly their mothers – a healthy and safe pregnancy and birth.

We should spare a moment and say thank you to those in the community who will be working or on-call during the Christmas and New Year period. These essential services (health, police, emergency services and council staff) whether a fulltime role or volunteer – we really appreciate what you do in keeping us all safe and well and our daily needs catered for.

I am always aware that there are some of us and our families will be traveling over the Christmas and New Year break. Please take extra care when driving and be acutely aware of your surroundings. You might be the safest driver, but in an instant the conditions will change, and you need to be ready to take corrective action to save lives.

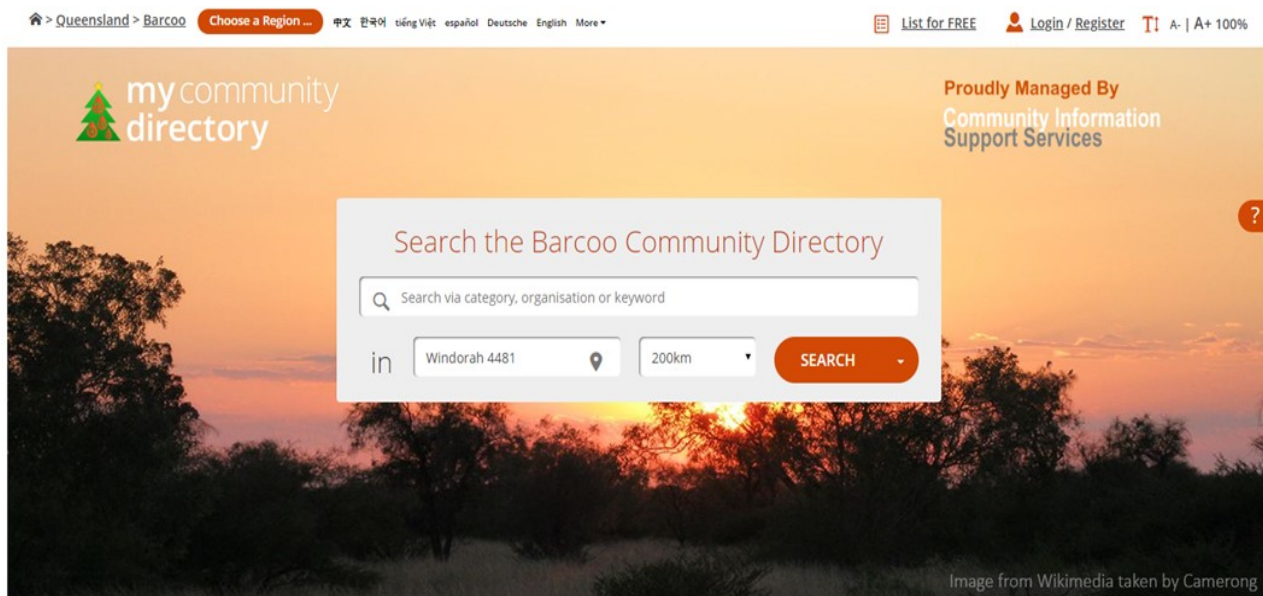

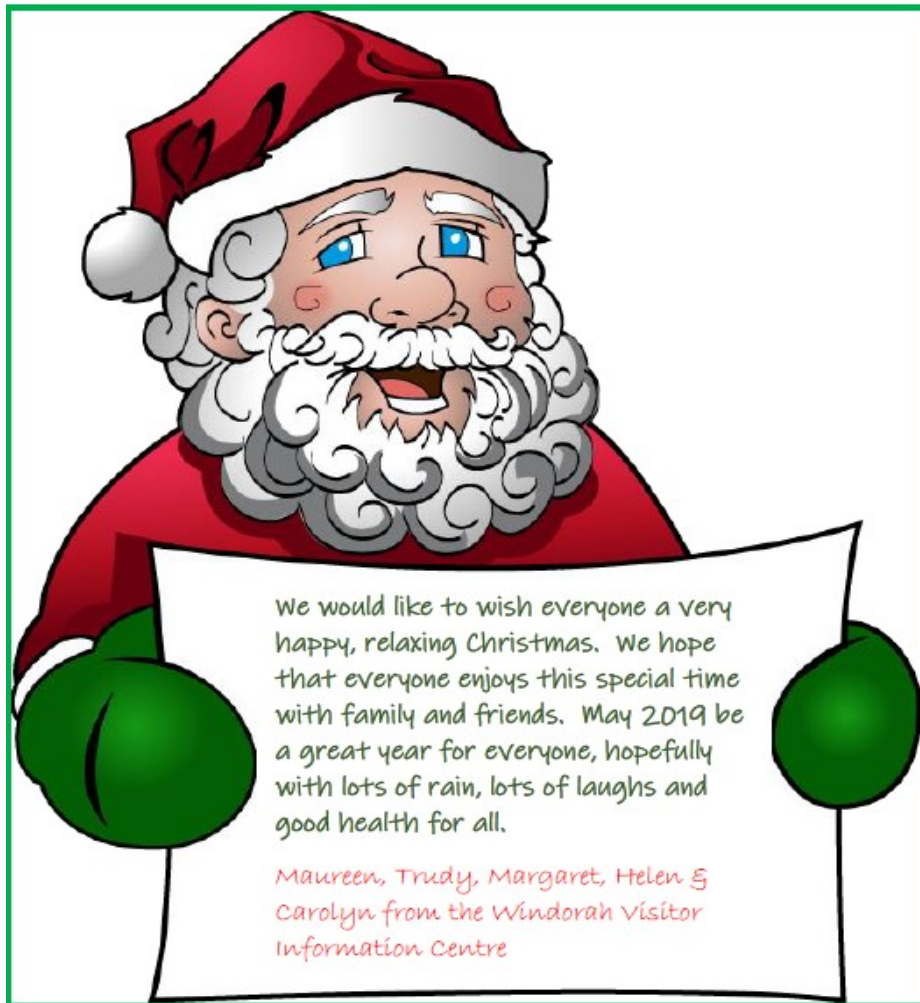

## Board Update

November 2018

Strategic planning and priority setting was on the agenda for the November meeting of the Board. Members were joined by the Executive Leadership Team to conduct a performance review and look at the work required to deliver on investment made by the Department of Health. We also considered strategies required to achieve the outcomes identified. Value, safety and quality are at the forefront of all of our discussions.

The outcomes from this day will inform the draft 2019-2023 strategic plan and we will look forward to engaging with staff and communities of the Central West in the refinement of this plan and development of operational business plans.

The month of November also saw our Safety and Quality Committee conduct their own planning session. The outcomes of this planning day were development of the 2019 forward work plan and an updated terms of reference for the Committee.

The comprehensive forward plan details the revised approach the Committee will take in supporting the Board seek and receive assurances relative to the delivery of consistent, safe and reliable care across all Central West Health facilities.

The Board's Finance Committee also met in November and look forward to progressing the work being undertaken to review the way in which the health service engages with its funding partners in the pursuit of value based healthcare.

The discussions are continuing and the Board is supporting our Health Service Chief Executive, Ms Jane Hancock, in the pursuit of resourcing an outcome based approach to

healthcare funding that is flexible, agile and better able to respond to the needs of people of the Central West.

The Finance Committee also received a comprehensive update from the Building, Engineering and Maintenance Services department. This report will now become a regular inclusion in the workplan of the Committee to ensure that in-depth maintenance and infrastructure investment costs and needs are available to the Board for consideration.

Infrastructure provides staff with the tools to carry out their jobs and, as such, it is a critical facilitator of the delivery of safe, quality and consistent care to Central West Queenslanders.

This week will see each of our sub committees meet for the final time in 2018. This will be followed by our last Board meeting for the year which will be held in Brisbane following a State-wide meeting with other board members and chief executives.

The last edition of the Board Update will be published later this month but for those heading off early for a well-earned break – safe travels and best wishes for the festive season.

# Central West Queensland Skills Investment Project

RAPAD has secured RSIS funding for the Central West Queensland (CWQ) Skills Investment Project, a two-year project focusing on the following key industries in the Central West Queensland region:

- » Agriculture (sheep and wool)
- » Tourism and Hospitality
- » Community Services



*This Regional Skills Investment Strategy project is proudly supported and funded by the Queensland Government.*



RAPAD is partnering with the Queensland Government to identify current and emerging jobs in our region and ensure there is a supply of skilled local people to meet this demand.

The Queensland Government's Regional Skills Investment Strategy (RSIS) is a \$9 million initiative funded over four years that supports selected regional communities to identify current and emerging jobs in key industries and ensure there is a supply of skilled local people to meet this demand. RSIS will bridge the gap between existing training opportunities provided through the Annual VET Investment Plan and current workforce skill needs in targeted regions.

To address local workforce issues related to skilling and training, the CWQ Skills Investment Project will work with local businesses, industry bodies and community stakeholders to:

- » identify available and emerging jobs in the target industries and the skills needed,
- » analyse current training options and identify gaps or issues in our region, and
- » collaborate with local employers and the Department of Employment, Small Business and Training (DESBT) to develop training solutions to address local skills and workforce challenges in the target industries.

The CWQ Skills Investment Project will be guided by local community and industry stakeholders through an engaged reference group.





## How can you help improve training pathways and build a skilled workforce across the RAPAD region?

The CWQ Skills Investment Project Reference Group will be chaired by the RSIS Project Coordinator and will include representatives from the seven local councils in the RAPAD region, representatives from the target industries, DESBT and other parties.

The CWQ Skills Investment Reference Group will:

- » Provide advice on the development, implementation, delivery and evaluation of the CWQ Skills Investment Project;
- » Provide advice and support regarding the local economic, social, environmental and geographic factors that affect proposed RSIS project activities;
- » Meet regularly to identify key project priorities, objectives and milestones, and drive the development of the project plan;
- » Provide specialist advice and support to identify possible training solutions, to be determined locally and in partnership with relevant stakeholders; and
- » Promote RSIS and the role of the reference group to stakeholders as a forum for collaboration, coordination and innovation.

We welcome volunteers for the CWQ Skills Investment Project Reference Group.

## Christmas recipe

### Traditional White Christmas

#### Ingredients;

- ¾ cup dried fruit medley (try to pick a mix with glacé cherries)
- 3 cups puffed rice cereal
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- ¾ cup pure icing sugar, sifted
- 1 cup skim powdered milk
- ¼ cup chopped natural almonds, toasted
- 2 tsp grated fresh orange zest
- 250 g vegetable shortening



#### Method;

- ◆ Lightly grease and line the base and two long sides of a 26cm x 16cm brownie tin with baking paper.
- ◆ Chop any large pieces of fruit or glacé cherries and place into a large bowl. Add remaining fruit, along with the Rice Bubbles, coconut, icing sugar, powdered milk, almonds and orange zest. Mix with a wooden spoon to combine, ensuring fruit is evenly distributed. Make a well in the centre.
- ◆ Melt the vegetable shortening in a small pan over a low heat. Cool slightly, then pour into the dry ingredients and mix well. Working quickly, press the mixture into the prepared tin.
- ◆ Chill for 20 minutes or until set. Remove from the tin and place onto a board. Using a sharp flat-bladed knife, cut into 3cm squares. Dust with icing sugar.
