

Jundah State School is currently at Windorah Sports Camp and having an absolutely fabulous time.

This month has been extremely hectic for many reasons. Assessment tasks were completed and the students wrote a traditional tale that they presented to the class. The stories were enjoyable and there were some very interesting ideas. Report cards have been written and will be sent home on the last day of the term.

The students also had a sleepover with Windorah and Stonehenge State Schools coming to Jundah State School. Go-cart building and chalk pastel drawings were the activities for the next day, with three go-carts being built (one for each school). Miss Helen did chalk pastel drawings and the students learnt to use this medium. The students used the time to do several drawings and finish with a major artwork.

The visits to Stonehenge have continued culminating in a visit for a morning of work and lunch on the lawn. The Stonehenge students and Mr Kempthorne show cased the work they have been doing for the term. We then had a very enjoyable BBQ on the lawn and the students were able to play.

Steve Cavill, the flying pastor also made a visit to the school and shared stories with the students.

The NRL development team visited the school and worked with the students on ball and coordination skills. Students were very keen to play the games and learn the skills they were taught.

The housing improvement plan is also in place, with the two teacher accommodations being upgraded with a refurbishment that is happening over the next month or so. Council housing has been made available while this is occurring.

Staff have also been to training. The cluster teacher and teacher aides went to a two day reading workshop in Longreach, staff completed the STRIVE speech workshop with the speech pathologist and staff participated in an online training workshop for literacy.

Kindy have been following the traditional tales theme and reading fairy tales. Dragons, fairies and castles have provided some very interesting conversations. They often create their own impression of the story in a variety of mediums.

Movement Records – is your record book up to date?



Movement records are required when moving horses between properties in Queensland.

The registered biosecurity entity who keeps the animal must complete the movement record before the animal is moved.

A movement record can be completed in hard copy or electronically and must include the following details:

- name of person completing the record
- · place (PIC) from which the animal is being moved
- place (PIC) where the animal is being moved to and the address of the person receiving the animal
- the date of movement
- species and breed of animal being moved
- description of the animal or group of animals (i.e. distinguishing marks)
- any other information required by regulation (i.e. HGP status, restricted animal material feeding)

A movement record for horses must be kept by the person completing it and the person receiving the animals for 2 years after the movement.



Flood Damage Repair Work

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF BARCOO SHIRE



Slow Cooker BBQ Ribs



Ingredients

Serves: 12

2.75 kg pork ribs

1 pinch black pepper

1 pinch salt

1 pinch dried red chilli

1 litre BBQ sauce

2 stubbies stout, room temperature

Directions

- 1. Cut ribs into small portions of 2 or 3 bones each. Bring a large pot of water to the boil. Add the salt, black pepper and dried red chilli to the water. Boil the ribs in seasoned water for 20 minutes. Drain, and let the ribs sit for about half an hour.
- 2. Meanwhile, preheat the BBQ to high. Lightly coat the ribs with BBQ sauce. Cook the ribs over high heat for 5 to 10 minutes on each side to get a nice barbecued look to them.
- 3. Place BBQ ribs in a slow cooker. Pour remaining BBQ sauce and one bottle of stout over the ribs; this should cover at least half of the ribs. Cover, and cook on high for 3 hours. Check ribs every hour or so, and add more stout if needed to dilute sauce. Stir to get the ribs on top into the sauce. The ribs are done when the meat is falling off the bone. The ribs were cooked completely in the first process, the rest is about flavour and texture.

Cook's Note: If you add too much stout, the sauce will get very thin. It is best to drink most of the second bottle.
