## Buckle up! No excuses...

The simple fact is seatbelts save many lives. Coupled with good driving behaviour, extra safety features and safer roads, your much more likely to survive if involved in a road crash.



A driver will be **penalised** with a **fine** and **demerit points** if they are caught driving without a seat belt. The driver will also be penalised if he carries passengers below 16 years of age who are not wearing seat belts or approved child restraints. A passenger may also be penalised for not wearing a seat belt but the penalty for a passenger is only a fine and not demerit points.

## Myth busters

"If it's a short trip, I don't need to wear a seatbelt"

It doesn't matter if you're only travelling around the corner, all drivers and passengers must wear a seatbelt or an approved child restraint. Most road crashes happen close to home. Even at low speeds, not wearing a seatbelt can result in serious injury or death.

"Truckies don't need to wear seatbelts so they'll be 'thrown clear' from the truck in the event of a crash"

Seatbelts are mandatory in all heavy vehicles and design regulations have been improved to make seatbelts more comfortable in trucks. Heavy vehicle drivers involved in a crash are 6 times more likely to die if not wearing a seatbelt.

## **Distractions in Everyday Driving**

If you're driving your vehicle, you are already multitasking.

At a minimum you are:

- operating a piece of heavy machinery at high speed
- navigating across changing terrain
- calculating speeds and distances
- responding to all the other drivers and obstacles around you.

Putting one more activity in the mix – even talking to your passengers or changing a radio station – can be enough to make you lose control of your vehicle or fail to respond in an emergency.



Don't touch the dial

Adjust seat positions, climate controls, sound systems and other devices while the vehicle is

#### stopped.

Stop to eat or drink

It may be tempting to have your meal while driving, but you're safer when you stop to eat. Reducing your risk will be worth the time you spend.

- Pull over to safe place to talk on the phone or to send text messages Mobile phones are a great resource for getting help but whether it's a handheld phone or a handsfree device, talking while driving cause you to take your mind off the task at hand.
- Plan ahead

Check directions and traffic/road conditions before you leave, so you'll be prepared for journey. If possible don't travel alone.

- Don't multitask and drive
  - Driving is complicated enough. Just drive
- Pull over to care for children If you need to tend to children, pull over in a safe place. Don't try to handle children while you're driving

In Queensland, if you are caught not having proper control of the vehicle you could be issued with an infringement notice, or you could be issued a notice for careless driving which involves both a fine and loss of demerit points.

Depending on the situation you could even be issued a notice to appear in court for traffic related matters resulting in a traffic and sometimes criminal history.

So next time you reach for that water bottle or plan on snacking whilst driving, remember you could be driving distracted and could be issued with traffic infringements.

## Remember, Driver distraction is one of the Fatal Five.

As adults we must model safe driving behaviours and teach our community to limit distractions and focus on the road.

From the morning tea \$500.70 was raised, a fantastic effort along with \$1000 from staff donations.





## Jundah State School News

Term 4 started after the public holiday. In English, students are doing a multi-age Prep to Year 6 unit on Poetry – humorous poetry. This is a trial unit from the work the Outback Advantage schools have been doing with the Curriculum team in Brisbane. In Maths, a number unit of algebra (operations) and location and transformation is being trialled. This is another multi-age unit.

A workshop on fierce conversations was attended by Mrs Volker and explored some of the conventions of conversations. It highlighted the strategies to use to enhance communication skills.

Miss Roisin, Miss Byrnes and Mrs Volker attended a Sheena Cameron reading comprehension workshop and many practical strategies were discussed. The emphasis on the importance of reading and like any skill that is being learnt the key is practise, practise, practise and more practise.



The loss of Kath Millar, who was always interested in what was happening at the school, was a sad occasion and our condolences go to the family.

The car rally rolled into town and rolled out again with many very imaginative displays and "dressed up" cars. Students had the opportunity to observe some of the cars as they passed by on their departure. Congratulations to the P&C for their support and assistance with the catering. The members of the car rally were very polite and friendly with many of them extremely impressed with the meal provided.

Mrs Volker returned to Brisbane to continue the work with the curriculum team and further advance the multi-age curriculum for small schools and especially our school. Mrs Mauro was the aspirant principal who was at the school and enjoyed the experience of working in a small school and working with the multi-age P – Year 6 curriculum.

Also, Miss Natalia Bozinova, a practicum student from the Australian Catholic University commenced a four week practical experience at Jundah State School. Miss Bozinova was travelling with her father and completed her third year practicum. This has been a joint project with the Barcoo Shire Council who have provided a fully furnished flat with subsidised rental assistance.

"Remote Kindergarten provides children in rural and remote communities the opportunity to attend a kindergarten program in a face-to-face environment in selected state schools. The kindergarten program is delivered by the existing classroom teacher in a composite class setting with support from a teacher aide."


There have been over 12 000 total package unit downloads across the state of Queensland.

#### Junior Sports Award


#### Eliaible nominees must be 25 years or younger as of 26 January 2020

#### PROPOSED BARCOO SHIRE PLANNING SCHEME OPEN FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Barcoo Shire Council is pleased to advise that the proposed new Barcoo Shire Planning Scheme is now on public display. The community and stakeholders are encouraged to review the document and invited to provide feedback.

The purpose of the proposed planning scheme is to shape and manage development in the Barcoo Shire over the next 10-20 years.

The proposed planning scheme can be viewed:

- online at http://www.barcoo.qld.gov.au/environment-planning/town-planning-scheme
- In person at the office of Barcoo Shire Council at 6 Perkins Streets, Jundah and customer service counters at Stratford Street, Stonehenge or 7 Maryborough Street, Windorah.

Interested parties may also purchase a copy of the document in addition to inspection.

Any person can make a written submission about any aspect of the proposed planning scheme during the public consultation period. The public consultation period is from Friday, 1 November 2019 up to and including Friday, 20 December 2019.

Submissions must be made in writing or by email. Properly made submissions must:

- state the name and residential or business address of each submitter; and
- state the grounds of the submission, and the facts and circumstances relied on to support the grounds;
   and
- state one postal or electronic address for service relating to the submission for all submitters; and
- be signed by each person making the submission, however signatures are not required for email (electronic) submissions; and
- Be made to Barcoo Shire Council and be received on or before Friday, 20 December 2019.

## Cinnamon Roll Christmas Tree

#### Ingredients

- 60 ml water
- 2 tsp yeast
- 80 ml milk
- 2 tbs butter
- 1 tsp salt
- 60 g caster sugar
- 2 cup plain flour
- 1 lemon (zested)
- 1 egg

#### FOR CINNAMON

#### FILLING

- 2 tbs butter (softened)
- 100 g caster
   sugar
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon

#### FOR THE GLAZE

- 80 g icing sugar
- 2 tsp milk

#### Method



Preheat oven to 180C (160C fan-forced). Combine water and yeast in a small bowl with a pinch of caster sugar. Leave for 3-4 minutes until frothy. In a small saucepan; heat milk until almost boiling. Add butter, salt and sugar and stir to combine. Set aside to cool. Stir through yeast mixture. In a stand mixer with a dough hook, combine flour and lemon zest. Add wet mixture and egg. Mix for 8 minutes or until soft and elastic. Place dough in an oiled bowl, cover with a tea towel and set aside somewhere warm for 1 1/2 hours until dough has doubled in size.



Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Roll out into a large rectangle, approximately 5mm thick. Smear entire surface with butter. Combine sugar with cinnamon, and sprinkle this over the dough.



Starting at one end, roll the dough into a log and slice into 18 even pieces.



On a large oven tray lined with baking paper, arrange cinnamon rolls in a Christmas tree shape. Bake for 20-25 minutes until lightly brown. For glaze, combine icing sugar and milk in a small bowl. Drizzle diagonally across the cooled cinnamon roll Christmas tree.
