Sale of Tonkoro & Vergemont

Earlier in the month I attended a site visit to Vergemont with the Deputy DG for Environment and Science Ben Klaasen following the rumoured sale of Vergemont and Tonkoro to National Parks. The Vergemont sale has since been announced officially and the conversations have begun with the Department with many of the concerns held in our communities. Discussions include access roads maintenance, coexistence with opal mining industry, investment in linear fencing to assist the program, exclusion program, good neighbour eradication/control of WONS, boundary baiting, targeted park baiting, fire mitigation and additional staff. These conversations have a two year period to be negotiated. Through RAPAD a working group will be formed.

The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway delays due to weather
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade – contractor due on site to incorporate current alarm system with new filter system, to be completed by June
- Water meter installation replacement of faulty meters continuing in Jundah, Windorah and Stonehenge

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire.

- Dave Ross's crew are continuing with flood damage on Mutti Connemara Rd.
- Jason Beilby's crew are continuing work on the Bimerah Isisford Rd project. Contractor Crew are continuing flood damage on Moorabree Rd.
- Flying gang are working on the bulk signage project between Windorah and Birdsville.
- Contractor grid crew have installed a new grid at Hayfield and will continue to clean grids out on the Arrabury Rd. The maintenance grader will be doing work on the Windorah Quilpie Rd in the vicinity of Tenham.

If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next meeting will be held in Windorah on the 27th of May 2024.


DOG REGISTRATION


Barcoo Shire Council has new pricing for half year dog registration. If you have just moved to the Shire or have now got a dog it's the time to register them.

A maximum of 2 dogs per house applies without a permit. All dogs must be registered after 3 months of age or within: 14 days of acquiring the dog or 28 days of becoming a new resident of a region. An application for a permit to keep additional dogs can be lodged to Council. A permit will only be issued if your application is approved. If your animals in no longer in the Shire please let us know so we can update your details.

Dog registration fees:

- Entire dog yearly \$59.00
- Entire dog half yearly (Jan-June) \$35.40
- Desexed dog \$32.00
- Desexed dog half yearly (Jan-June) \$19.20
- Entire Dog Pensioner \$33.63
- Entire Dog Pensioner half yearly (Jan-June) \$20.18
- Desexed Dog Pensioner \$18.24
- Desexed Dog Pensioner half yearly (Jan-June) \$10.94
- Regulated Dog / 3rd Dog- Restricted/Permit \$250.00


